WORLD KIDO FEDERATION KOREA TRIP 2021: CITIES WE ARE VISITING



Busan, second largest city in South Korea

Busan, a large port city in South Korea, is known for its beaches, mountains and temples. Busy Haeundae Beach features the Sea Life Aquarium, plus a Folk Square with traditional games such as tug-of-war, while Gwangalli Beach has many bars and views of modern Diamond Bridge. Beomeosa Temple, a Buddhist shrine founded in 678 A.D., is at the base of Geumjeong Mountain, which has hiking trails.

Kyoung Ju, former capital of Unified Silla

Among such historical treasures, Seokguram grotto, Bulguksa temple, Gyeongju Historic Areas and Yangdong Folk Village are designated as World Heritage **Sites** by UNESCO. The many major historical **sites** have helped Gyeongju become one of the most popular tourist destinations in South Korea.

Suwon-si, city in South Korea

Suwon is the capital of Gyeonggi Province, in northwestern South Korea. It's known for the late-18th-century Hwaseong Fortress, with its commanding stone wall and 4 pagodatopped arched gates. Near Hwahongmun Gate, Hwaseong Haenggung Palace has a traditional banquet hall. The raised Yeonmudae Post, once a military training ground, offers fortress views. Suwon Hwaseong Museum explores the construction of the fortress.

Seoul, capital of South Korea

Seoul, the capital of South Korea, is a huge metropolis where modern skyscrapers, high-tech subways and pop culture meet Buddhist temples, palaces and street markets. Notable attractions include futuristic Dongdaemun Design Plaza, a convention hall with curving architecture and a rooftop park; Gyeongbokgung Palace, which once had more than 7,000 rooms; and Jogyesa Temple, site of ancient locust and pine trees.
